From The Supervisor's Desk

Spring is just around the corner. Are you ready?

And with Spring comes the usual questions. Hopefully the following will answer some of them for you.

1. Roads:

- The following is a list of roads that are on our list to repair this year:
- a. Lewis Avenue - 1,100 feet north of Sterns Road to the Railroad Tracks 2.48 miles
 - b. Sterns Road - Telegraph Road to Lewis Avenue 1.76 miles
 - c. Douglas Road - Dean Road to Temperance Road 1.00 Mile
 - d. Douglas Road - Sterns Road to Dean Road 1.00 Mile
 - e. Summerfield Road - Smith Road to Douglas Road 0.70 Mile

As you know the Monroe County Road Commission has the responsibility of caring for all our roads (*With the exception of a few private drives*). And, just to be clear, there is only a very, very small amount of your property taxes that go toward the repair of roads. To find out specific amounts, you may call the Supervisors Department and they will furnish a break down of percentages of each fund for you. If your street is still on the waiting list and you have pot holes that need attention. Please call 734.847.6791 extension 122, and report the problem.

2. Yards: It probably seems a ways away before we have to get out the lawn mower, but believe me it will be here before we realize. Please keep your yard and lot mowed this summer. We want our township to look its best and your neighbors will really appreciate you effort. Keeping a neat yard will also keep the rodents, snakes and mosquitoes away also. That's a **GOOD** thing.

3. Burning: Remember that you may burn yard waste during the months of April, May, September, October and November. Please call for 734.847.6791 for all other types and times for burning.

4. Mosquito Spraying: Spraying usually starts in May. Please do your part to keep standing water on your property to a minimum. Last year was an extremely good year for mosquitoes. Let's try to make this year a banner year for **NO MOSQUITOES**.

Passport Information

Bedford Township Hall has been a passport agency since October of 2003. We are delighted to be able to assist our residents as well as residents of other communities in acquiring a passport so that they can travel abroad. The \$67⁰⁰ fee to the U.S. Department of State must be in the form of a check or money order for citizens who wish to apply for a passport at Bedford Township Hall. The \$30⁰⁰ execution fee and \$10⁰⁰ fee for photographs can be paid by check, money order or cash.

If you are planning a trip outside of the United States, please allow 10 to 12 weeks processing time for passport applications. If you need a passport in 4 weeks or less, the U.S. Passport Service will “expedite” your application for an extra \$60⁰⁰ fee per application. With this extra fee, your passport application will be processed in 2 to 3 weeks.

If you wish to have Bedford Township take your passport photos, a \$10⁰⁰ additional fee will be charged along with the \$30⁰⁰ execution fee. Bedford Township’s hours for accepting passport applications is Monday-Friday, 8:00 am til 5:00 pm. For any other information, you can go to our website, www.bedfordmi.org and

“click” on passport information. From this site you can get general information or access the U.S. State Department’s website. If you do not have internet access, please call me or one of my staff at 734.847.791.

Latest News From The U.S. Department of State

- Effective January 23, 2007 – Passports will be required for all air travel border crossings, as well as land, sea, & air travel to all countries except between the U.S. and Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Bermuda.
- A limited-use passport in card format is currently under development and will be available for use for travel only via land or sea between the U.S. and Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Bermuda. It will be similar in size to a credit card and will fit easily into a wallet. This Pass Card is not in use as yet, but we will notify residents as soon as we get word from the State Department as to when it will be available and what the cost will be.

If you have any questions or concerns about this or any other travel outside of the United States, go to the state department’s web site at www.travel.state.gov. This site will also give you information regarding visa requirements, safety issues and immunization requirements in certain countries, and a great deal of other important information that will make travel plans easier for you. □



S.N.i.P. Spay/Neuter Day

S.N.i.P. – *Spaying/Neutering is Prevention*, in cooperation with **Humane Ohio**, is offering a special one-day service to Bedford area residents who wish to have their dog or cat spayed/neutered.

The **Humane Ohio** van will be at the Kroger parking lot, at Sterns and Secor Roads in Lambertville, from 7:30-7:45 a.m. on **Wednesday, April 25**. Only those cats and dogs with **S.N.i.P.** vouchers will be transported to the Humane Ohio facilities for the surgery. Pets will be returned to the same location at approximately 8:00 a.m. the following day for pick-up. Please arrive promptly on both days. Pets should be in carriers with your name clearly marked on the outside. **S.N.i.P.** has a limited number of carriers available for those who need them.

S.N.i.P. offers subsidized vouchers to low-income families, multiple-pet owners, as well as families experiencing other financial difficulties. The client’s cost for the surgery varies between \$10⁰⁰ and \$55⁰⁰ depending on various criteria such as family income, number of pets, the weight and gender of the pet, etc. If you are interested in participating in the Spay/Neuter Day, please call 734.856.7326 or 734.847.1130 for a **S.N.i.P. application** form. Individuals or families who qualify will be sent a **S.N.i.P.** voucher to be presented to the Humane Ohio staff on Wednesday, April 25. □

Did You Know?

- The only election scheduled for 2007 is the May 8, 2007 Annual School Election.
- For this election, we have three (3) candidates for two (2) four year terms, two (2) candidates for one (1) two year unexpired term, and a request for a Sinking Fund Millage. For information on either the candidates or the millage proposal, contact Bedford Public Schools, 850-6000.
- The candidates for the four year terms are (*in alphabetical order*): Laura Keehn, Ann Myers, and Mike Smith.
- The candidates for the unexpired two (2) year term are (*in alphabetical order*): Joe Gore and Fred Swank.
- If you have any questions as to where to go to vote, please call the Bedford Township Hall at 847-6791, extension 134, or visit the Township Website at www.bedfordmi.org, and click on Clerk, then Voter Information Website, where you will access a statewide lookup for precinct locations.
- If you wish to vote in the June school election, but will be out of town on election day, you may request an absentee ballot until Saturday, May 5, 2007 at 2:00 p.m. Call 847-6791, extension 134.
- The Clerk's Department at Bedford Township Hall will be open on Saturday, May 5, 2007 from 8:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. for absentee ballots. We will **NOT** be able to take payments or handle questions for any other department.

Bedford Township maintains a permanent absentee list for our registered voters. If you are 60 years or older or have a disability, and wish to vote absentee, you can call the clerk's department and be placed on the list. We will send you an absentee ballot application for each election. All you have to do is fill out the application and send (*or drop it off*) it back to the township hall, and a ballot will be sent to you. □

Winter Kill

Are newly dead branches on some of your woody plants this spring causing you to wonder if you should have wrapped those naked limbs in burlap (*or maybe heat tape*)? Don't be too quick to blame cold weather. Winter damage to plants hardy for this region is frequently due to other causes. Stressed plants don't over-winter well. The following tips may help prepare them better for next winter:

- Roots freeze faster than branches, so mulch well, especially for the first year or two after planting your tree or shrub.
- Plants take up water until the ground freezes. Water them well until then.
- Know your plants' preferred growing conditions and site them accordingly. Bear in mind winter sun angles and prevailing winds.
- Don't do major pruning in mid-fall. Instead, bring out those clippers in February and March, or after flowering for spring-blooming plants.
- Use plant-friendly products to melt snow and ice rather than salt.
- When buying new plants, look for winter hardiness rated at Zone 5 or colder.
- And spread those roots out when you put that new specimen in the ground. Cut back strangling and dangling roots on pot-bound specimens.

Then accept that early or late cold snaps, when trees and shrubs are either not hardened off yet or are emerging from dormancy, may take their toll on flower or even leaf buds. And hope for better luck next year. □

Reminders For 2007 Taxes

The 2007 Summer Tax bills will be mailed on July 1. Don't forget that all of the County General Tax will be on this summer's tax bill, as per Public Act 357, along with the State Education Tax. There will not be any County General Tax on your winter tax bill but the County Library and the County Senior Tax will continue to be collected on your winter bill. If you have changed mortgage companies, refinanced or moved be sure to call our office at 734.847.6791, and let us know so we can send the tax bill to the correct place.

Sewer & Water Information

Sewer Rates For 2007

Sewer Rates will increase for 2007 because of the sharp increase in the cost of chemicals, insurance coverage, utilities and fuel costs. Interest revenues, which have been used in the past to temper the sewer rates, continue to be low. Also the use of secondary meters affects the billable flow for future years and also decreases the estimated billable flow for the current year.

The average quarterly bill for residents on a well will be \$79.20 in 2007 versus \$75.30 in 2006. Residents on a well will pay the \$79.20 quarterly.

Well meters which will meter your household usage and reduce your quarterly rate if you use less than 20,000 gallons of water a quarter are available through the township. For more information contact the Utility Clerk at 734.847.6791.

This information is for those of you that reuse envelopes that you receive from credit card companies or banks. We are receiving sewer payments late because the payment was mailed in a return envelope received from a Credit Card Company. Credit Card Companies code the return envelope with a bar code that the United States Postal Service equipment reads and delivers to that bar code address. By the time the Credit Card Company or Bank realizes that the check is made out to someone else the sewer bill is late.

Park Board News

Since this is the first township newsletter of 2007 and spring will soon be here, we are repeating an article that was last published in January of 2006, giving residents some basic park rules and regulations. They are as follows:

Rental costs of either Community Center for Bedford residents will be a fee of \$200⁰⁰ and a refundable deposit of \$200⁰⁰. \$50⁰⁰ of the fee must be paid at the time of the reservation, with the remaining \$350⁰⁰ to be paid when the key is picked up. We will no longer take telephone reservations for either Community Center.

Costs for a non-Bedford resident, will be \$225⁰⁰, with a refundable deposit of \$200⁰⁰, and \$50⁰⁰ to be paid in order to hold the reservation.

Cancellation notification must be received 30 days in advance of the event in order to receive refund of the \$50⁰⁰ down payment.

There are no changes with regard to reserving the shelters at the township parks. You must make a reservation and come into the township hall to sign the form in order to guarantee your reservation.

If you have any inquiries as to the availability of the Community Centers or would like to reserve a shelter, please call 734.847.6791, extension 134.

The Park Board has also made some changes to the rules and regulations regarding the usage of the parks in general. Here is a recap of those changes.

1. Motor vehicles are prohibited in township parks except in designated parking areas.
2. Only skateboards and in-line skates are permitted in the fenced skateboard ramp and riding course areas.
3. The speed limit for all types of motor vehicles on roadways and parking areas shall be no more than 10 MPH.
4. Fires are only allowed in grills or fireplaces unless specifically authorized in writing by a designated representative of the Park Commission.
5. Firearms or bows and arrows, or any form of hunting is prohibited in the parks.
6. Park hours are from sunrise until sunset with the exception being Carr or Samaria Community Centers which may remain

open until 1:00 am.

7. No person shall tamper with park locks or locking mechanisms. Duplicating of park keys is prohibited and all keys must be returned to the Park Commission after authorized use has lapsed.
8. Park lights cannot be used without a valid permit or authorization by the Park Board.
9. Loud speakers are not permitted without permission of the Park Board.
10. The sale of food, drink, ice, newspapers or any other product is prohibited without written permission of the Park Board.
11. No person shall destroy, damage, deface or remove any publicly owned property in the park, including tree shrubs, wild flowers or other vegetation.
12. Cans, bottles, papers or other rubbish shall be placed in receptacles and not be dumped or left on the park grounds, or in waterways within areas adjacent to a park.
13. No person shall relocate, move or disturb any publicly owned property in the park, including benches and picnic tables.
14. Alcohol, intoxicating beverages and other controlled substances are strictly prohibited.
15. Obscene or profane language shall be prohibited within said parks.
16. Unleashed dogs, cats and all other pets are strictly prohibited in said parks, including the designated parking areas within said parks. All pets shall be under the direct physical control of the owner and shall be on a leash not exceeding 12 feet long.
17. All waste refuse and litter deriving from pets shall be disposed of properly.
18. No pets shall be allowed within the Playscapes.

Last but by no means least, the Park Board is announcing two new members to the board, effective immediately. The board has approved the appointment of Mr. Rick Garrett to fill the unexpired term of former commissioner Connie Vellequette; and Mr. Greg Szymanski to fill the unexpired term of former commissioner Mark Fuller. We welcome these new members to the board. □

News From The Assessing Department

The Assessing Department will begin the annual process of re-appraising properties throughout all of Sections 31, 32, and 28 in the Township. Smith, Secor, Sterns Roads, and Whiteford Township border section 31. Sterns, Secor, Smith, and Douglas Roads border section 32. Dean, Douglas, Sterns, and Jackman Roads border section 28. We will be inspecting all properties within these sections this year.

The purpose of these visits is to get accurate information on our property record cards so we can fairly and equitably assess the properties in these areas and throughout the Township. In addition to the previously mentioned sections, the Assessing Department will be visiting any properties that have any new construction,

remodeling, additions, etc. taking place throughout the year. The Township Assessing Department personnel always carry photo identification. If you have any questions regarding the personnel that come to your home, please do not hesitate to contact the Township Office at (734).847.6791.

The assessing information for the Township is available on the Township web site at www.befordmi.org. If you need a copy of the physical drawing of your home, map, etc. there is no charge for information on your own property. The Assessing Department's hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday thru Friday except for holidays. □

INTERNET PHONE SERVICE ("VoIP")

Will You be able to Reach 9-1-1 in an Emergency?

A new kind of phone service heavily advertised in Michigan offers inexpensive "Voice Over the Internet" telephone calling, also known as "VoIP." VoIP technology allows you to make telephone calls using a broadband Internet connection instead of a regular phone line. While VoIP may offer less expensive calling, consumers need to educate themselves before replacing their traditional telephone service with VoIP. There are many important differences between VoIP and traditional telephone services, including some that are less than obvious.

One of the most important differences relates to emergency 9-1-1 service. Some VoIP service providers may have limitations to their 9-1-1 service. For example, when a person calls 9-1-1 from a wireline telephone, emergency service providers automatically know the caller's location and can direct the correct emergency personnel to that location even if the caller is not able to provide an address. This is not always true for 9-1-1 calls placed from an Internet-based phone. Because VoIP services can be used wherever you travel, as long as a broadband Internet connection is available, the location of the caller cannot automatically be determined. Routing of 9-1-1 calls is based on the address the customer registers with the VoIP provider, rather than the address from which the call is actually made, if they are different.

In addition, VoIP service may not work during a power outage, or when the Internet connection fails or becomes overloaded. In May 2005, the Federal Communication Commission adopted rules requiring providers of interconnected VoIP services to supply 9-1-1 emergency calling capabilities to their customers as a mandatory feature of the service by November 28, 2005. "Interconnected" VoIP services are VoIP services that allow a user to receive and make calls to the traditional telephone network. Under the FCC rules, interconnected VoIP providers must:

- Deliver all 9-1-1 calls to the local emergency call center;
- Deliver the customer's call back number and location information where the emergency call center is capable of receiving it; and
- Inform their customers of the capabilities and limitations of their VoIP 9-1-1 service.

Tips for VoIP subscribers:

- Provide your accurate physical address to your VoIP service provider to ensure that emergency services can quickly be dispatched to your location. Be familiar with your VoIP service provider's procedures for updating your address and promptly update address information in the event of a change.
- Verify that you can access 9-1-1 with your phone by checking your VoIP provider's Web site. **DO NOT** dial 9-1-1 to test your

- access to the emergency response network.
- Be sure to activate the emergency calling feature of your service plan, if applicable.
- Have a clear understanding of any limitations of your 9-1-1 service.
- Inform children, babysitters, and visitors about your VoIP service and relevant limitations.
- Consider keeping a land line phone to access 9-1-1 emergency services.
