Things Bedford Township CAN Do For You!

1. Roads:

We can and do take advantage of allotted funds the Monroe County Road Commission is willing to bring to Bedford. Remember that road funds come from gas taxes and some licensing taxes that funnel through the Monroe County Road Commission. Bedford Township for the last three years has been pro-active in securing available grants. We can't fix every pot hole on a minutes notice, but do the best we can at reporting them. We also have no control over the Monroe County Road Commission budget. Your Township taxes only cover a minute amount of funds for roads. However 15 ½ miles of roads have been paved in the last three years and we're working on five more for this year.

2. Trash Pick-up:

We can and do provide a Township wide "Clean-up Day" (The date this year will be September 27) when any Township resident can bring large (*within reason*) or small items to White Park for disposal at no cost to the resident. The Township does not provide weekly trash pick-up. There are several companies in our area that do provide that service and will be happy to accommodate your needs.

3. Mosquitoes:

We can and do provide mosquito spray for our community. Unfortunately, the communities around us (*Whiteford, Ida, and Erie*) do not spray for mosquitoes. We also provide a limited amount of "mosquito pellets" that residents can utilize to kill the mosquito larva in standing water. Residents are responsible to care for their own homes that set back a long length from the main road and for treed areas that can not be reached from the main road.

4. Drainage:

We can and do work closely with the Monroe County Drain Commission and the Monroe County Road Commission to check and repair any drain problem reported. The Monroe County Drain Commission is now available at the Township Hall one afternoon a month (*the 3rd Thursday of the month*) to assist with citizens concerns. We are pleased to bring additional services to Bedford.

5. Newspapers Under Mailboxes:

We can and will give tickets for littering to anyone caught throwing newspapers or advertising papers under mailboxes or in driveways without permission. Please assist us in keeping the area under the mailboxes clean and clear of old papers.

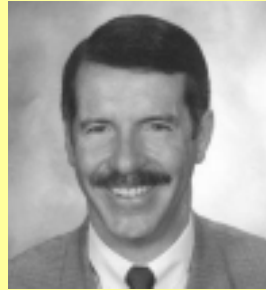

New Passport Information

Bedford Township Hall has been a passport agency since October of 2003. We are delighted to be able to assist our residents as well as residents of other communities in acquiring a passport so that they can travel abroad.

Effective February 1, 2008 major changes in applying for passports have been implemented. Below I am listing the important changes that will affect anyone wishing to apply for a passport.

The U.S. Department of State has now implemented a "passport card", which may only be used for land and sea travel to Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Bermuda. **It cannot be used for air travel.** It is a wallet sized card, and will provide a less expensive, smaller and more convenient alternative for those who travel frequently to the above destinations by land or sea. The fees are as follows:

The same information and photo will be required to be submitted as for a regular passport. You will fill out the application, submit a certified copy of your birth certificate, identification (such as a driver's license), and two (2) passport photos.

The next major change is the fee for a regular passport, as listed below:

The fees to the U.S. Department of State must be in the form of a check or money order for citizens who wish to apply for a passport at Bedford Township Hall. If you wish to have Bedford Township take your passport photos, a \$10⁰⁰ additional fee will be charged along with the \$25⁰⁰ execution fee. The \$25⁰⁰ execution fee and \$10⁰⁰ fee for photographs can be paid by check, money order or cash.

The third major change only affects children between the ages of 14 and 16. In the past, both parents were required to consent to their child applying for a passport if the child was under the age of 14. Effective **February 1, 2008**, that age limit has been raised to 16. In other words, all minors under age 16 will have to have the consent of both parents or legal guardian.

If you are planning a trip outside of the United States, please allow at least 6-7 weeks processing time for passport applications. If you need a passport sooner than that, you may want to consider expediting your passport application. The U. S. Passport Service will "expedite" your application for an extra \$60⁰⁰ fee per application. With this extra fee, your passport application will be processed in 2 weeks.

Bedford Township's hours for accepting passport applications is Monday-Friday, 8:00 am til 5:00 pm. For any other information, you can go to our website, bedfordmi.org and "click" on passport information. From this site you can get general information or access the U.S. State Department's website. If you do not have internet access, please call me or one of my staff at (734) 847-6791. ■

Your Township Treasurer's office has been busy collecting and disbursing the 2007 tax roll in the amount of \$30,390,394⁵⁰ for the summer and winter tax rolls. Preparing and collecting 15,000 tax bills twice a year is a huge job, but also enjoyable as you get to meet many township residents that you only see twice a year. Many of you really enjoyed our new **DRIVE THRU WINDOW** for paying your bills. It is especially nice in cold or rainy weather!

Even though the tax collection takes a lot of my time, there are many other aspects to the Treasurer's position. Being the Treasurer of a Township is not like being the Treasurer of a corporation or business. Residents think that the Treasurer controls all of the financial duties of the Township, but my duties are specified by statutes of the State of Michigan.

Accounts Payable and Accounts Receivable are handled by the Finance Director. By law, I am not permitted to handle these accounts. The reason the Treasurer and Clerk each balance the accounts is an integral part of governmental checks and balances.

Bedford Township has 17 bank accounts that must be balanced monthly. My job as Treasurer is to take each bank statement and match every deposit and withdrawal slip to the statement. This is much like you do at home only I have more accounts. Once I balance with the bank statement the statements are given to the Clerk who must rebalance the accounts to the general ledger that is also kept by the Clerk. This must be done monthly.

Let me state here that **I HAVE PERSONALLY BALANCED EACH AND EVERY BANK STATEMENT EVERY SINGLE MONTH** since I was sworn into office in 1984 as your Township Treasurer.

As Treasurer I keep a record of money received, money spent and the balance on hand, while the Clerk keeps a record that reflects the detailed revenue and expenditures of each fund. The township's main financial records are kept by the Clerk and are referred to as the General Ledger.

The Township Treasurer must have a written investment policy and an internal control policy as directed by the State of Michigan and approved by the Township Board. This also assures residents that the Township funds are invested safely.

In the 2006-2007 fiscal year over \$360,000⁰⁰ in interest was earned from Township funds. As you can see, handling the finances of Bedford Township is a difficult job and one that I take very seriously.

Sewer & Water Information SEWER RATES FOR 2008

Sewer Rates will increase for 2008 because of the sharp increase in the cost of chemicals, insurance coverage, utilities and fuel costs. Interest revenues, which have been used in the past to temper the sewer rates, continue to be low. Also the use of secondary meters affects the billable flow for future years and also decreases the estimated billable flow for the current year.

The average quarterly sewer use bill for residents on a well will be \$82⁰⁴ in 2008 versus \$79²⁰ in 2007. Residents that have sewer and are on a well will pay the \$82⁰⁴ quarterly for sewer use. Well meters, which will meter your household usage and reduce your quarterly rate if you use less than 20,000 gallons of water a quarter are available through the township. 2008 ELECTION NEWS

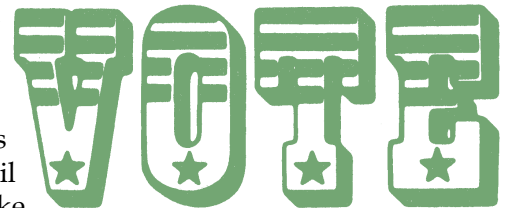
As I wrote in the December 2007 newsletter, 2008 will be a busy year for us with regard to elections. The January 15, 2008 election is now past, and the following three elections are scheduled:

MAY 6, 2008 • SCHOOL ELECTION

Two candidates are running for two open positions on the Bedford School Board: **Kim Hooper** and **Dale Barton** (*incumbent*) are the candidates. Bedford Public Schools also have two millage renewal propositions on the ballot. More information about the candidates and the millage proposals will be forthcoming in the Bedford School's Newsletter as well as local newspapers.

AUGUST 5, 2008 • PRIMARY ELECTION NOVEMBER 4, 2008 • PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION

As I mentioned in the last newsletter, I will be making changes to some of our current precinct locations due to problems with accessibility and availability. It will be necessary to change the voting locations for Precincts 3, 5, 6, 10 and 13. I am currently talking with two local churches to relocate to and plan to have the contracts signed *before* the May 6, 2008 School Election. I will utilize every available resource to inform you of the new location for your precinct. In addition, you will be receiving a new voter ID card in the mail before the May 6, 2008 School Election, as your official notification of your precinct change, please watch the mail for it. I realize these are big changes, and it bears repeating, I will make every effort (*articles in newspaper, TV, etc.*) to make sure all voters in these precincts are informed of the change. Serious consideration has been given before the decision was made to make the changes, and I believe these changes will make it easier for voters to exercise their right to vote.



I also want to remind you again, of how to check to make sure you're registered to vote or to check to see where you would go to vote. The easiest way to check if you have a computer is to go to our website, www.bedfordmi.org, "click" on clerk (*located on the left side of the page*), then scroll to the bottom of the page and "click" on Voter Information Website. This site will give you election information, tell you if you're registered to vote or where your precinct location is. If you do not have access to the web, just call my office, (734)847-6791, and ask for the clerk's department. Either I or one of my staff will be happy to assist you.

The other major change that bears repeating is that **all** voters going to the polls will have to show identification in order to vote. Examples of the approved types of identification are:

- Michigan Driver's License or Michigan Personal Identification Card.
- Driver's license or personal identification card issued by another state.
- Federal or state government issued photo identification.
- U.S. Passport.
- Current student identification with photo—from a high school or an accredited institution of higher education.
- Military identification card with photo.
- Tribal identification card with photo.

If you will notice, all of the examples mention a photo. Any ID needs to have a photo in order to be a valid form of identification for voting purposes. If the voter states that he or she does not have photo identification or did not bring it to the polls, the voter will be allowed to vote if he or she signs an "*Affidavit of Voter Not in Possession of Picture Identification*". This form will be available at the polling location. The law requiring photo identification in order to vote is part of Michigan Election law enacted by the State Legislature in 1996 but not implemented until now. ■

Township Hall UPDATE

As of this writing we have been in the new Township Government Center four and one-half months. I am happy to report that we have the few bugs worked out and operations are running smooth.

- We had some minor problems with the sound and video system in the Boardroom but they have been worked out. Part of the problem was we used the old equipment from the old building and adapted to the new setting. We will come in at some point time to request funds from the Town Board to up date and up grade our equipment.



- The Drive-up window on the south side of the building has passed all our expectations with the large usage from our citizens. We hope you find this service better for you. The Drive-up Window takes Taxes, Sewer Payments, Water payments and other business that can be transacted in your vehicle. The window is open 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday, to take your business. After hours there is a drop slot for your payments and Township business.
- There is a Security Camera 24 hours, 7 days a week at that location for security.
- We are in the process of getting the Situation/Disaster Room up and running.
- This will be done with the cooperation of the Monroe County Sheriff's Office, Bedford Fire/Rescue, County Disaster Services and our Public Officials.
- The new Sheriff's Office Substation on the north side of the new Government Center was up and running approximately the last week in October. There were only minor problems and they have been fixed.
- The old pole building where the Sheriff's Substation was located is now used for sheriff vehicles and storage.
- The door for the new Sheriff's Office Substation is on the Northwest side in front of the Government Center (*there is a sign*). The Substation *does not* always have officers in the building and if you have an emergency please **DIAL 911**.

Just a reminder we will be in the height of the Tornado Season this spring and summer. Tornadoes can strike in the day or night. Please be aware of local and regional weather conditions listen to your Radio and Television Stations for weather warnings. Monroe County and Bedford Township will activate the warning sirens as soon as we get information from the Weather Bureau of up coming storms.

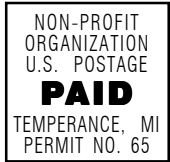
