PRESENTATIONS

INFORMATIONAL REPORT ON THE DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (DDA) Joyce Blanton, Vice Chair of the DDA presented the history, accomplishments, and future goals of the DDA.

<u>VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION FOR SAVE OUR SENIORS PROGRAM & AN UPDATE BY THE ORDINANCE DEPARTMENT</u> – Cecil recognized the volunteers of the Save Our Seniors program which assists seniors who are unable to comply with Township Ordinances. He presented certificates to Gene Stock, Rick Houke, Sam Pitzen, Steve Loudenslager, & Ray Houston. Jim Perkins, Tyler Ball, Nathan Nash, Adam Beaman & Brandon Chase were also recognized and thanked, but were unable to attend. Cecil then gave the Board an update on the Ordinance Department.

STAFF REPORTS

APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2019-2020 GENERAL FUND BUDGET — Dave Manning, Finance Director explained the adjustments. Board members discussed individual adjustments and expressed objection to the process in which some of them come to the Board after the cost have already been incurred. Motion was made by Clements, seconded by Montri to approve the budget adjustments as presented with two notations: to move the \$6,500.00 adjustment increase from Trustees to Legal fees and to have an offsetting \$175,000.00 cost moved from line item Roads to line item Capital Outlay. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Clements, Montri, Francis, Tienvieri, Steiner, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none.

APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2019-2020 SPECIAL FUNDS BUDGET – Discussion followed regarding the adjustment to the Fire Equipment Fund and why it wasn't included in the original budget. Massingill explained that the Board approved a \$100,000.00 down payment for the Fire Truck which wasn't anticipated when preparing the budget. These monies should be offset by the end of the year by revenue generated by ambulance runs and emergency response deployments. Motion was made by Francis, seconded by Tienvieri to approve the recommended budget adjustments for 2019/2020 in all the Special Revenue Funds, as presented. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Francis, Tienvieri, Steiner, Clements, Montri, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none.

<u>VOUCHERS FOR PAYMENT</u> - Motion was made by Hershberger, seconded by Francis to approve the following vouchers for payment: General Fund-\$356,909.03, Fire District-\$29,607.69, Police Fund-\$2,561.65, Park Fund-\$2,978.71, Fire Equipment-\$15,853.53, Transit System Fund-\$19,634.00, Library Operating Fund-\$3,536.87, Downtown Dev. Authority-\$7,408.08, Sewer Operation & Main. Fund-\$3,241.67, & Trust and Agency Fund-\$744.00 for a total of \$442,475.23. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Hershberger, Francis, Tienvieri, Montri, Steiner, Clements & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none.

APPROVAL OF A BID FOR THE RENOVATIONS/REPAIR OF FIRE STATION 1 – Jim Jacobs from James Jacobs Architects explained that the three companies with the lowest bids were vetted and his company recommends The Delventhal Company. Of the different options included in the bid, this recommendation is based on acceptance of alternative 2 and 3. Discussion followed regarding the funding of this project. Francis will bring finance options back to the next Board meeting. Motion was made by Tienvieri, seconded by Clements to accept the bid from Delventhal Company, 3796 Rockland Circle, Millbury, Ohio, as presented based on the recommendation. Motion carried on a roll call vote

as follows: Ayes: Tienvieri, Clements, Francis, Montri, Steiner, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none.

<u>APPROVAL TO PURCHASE ONE ADDITIONAL COMMUNITY WARNING SIREN</u> — Chief Massingill explained that this siren is too costly to repair, needs to be manually activated and is not tied into Monroe Central Dispatch. He recommended placing the new siren at Carr Park for optimum coverage. Motion was made by Tienvieri, seconded by Clements to approve the bid from West Shores Services, Inc. in the amount of \$21,800.00 for replacement of the Emergency Siren in Temperance, moving it to Carr Park. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Tienvieri, Clements, Steiner, Francis, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: Montri. Absent: none.

APPROVAL OF THE 2020 POVERTY EXEMPTION POLICY, GUIDELINES, APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS, INCOME & ASSET TEST GUIDELINES & THE APPLICATION – Matlow mentioned this is an annual requirement. Motion was made by Tienvieri, seconded by Steiner to approve the 2020 Poverty Exemption Policy and Guidelines as shown on page two of the packet. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Tienvieri, Steiner, Clements, Francis, Montri, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none.

<u>APPROVAL TO ADJUST THE 2020 POVERTY ASSET LIMITS</u> – Motion was made by Tienvieri, seconded by Steiner to approve the 2020 Poverty Asset limits at \$15,000.00, as it matches the Michigan Department of Health & Human Services posted asset limits. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Tienvieri, Steiner, Montri, Clements, Francis, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none.

<u>APPROVAL OF THE 2019 SENIOR CITIZEN TAX PENALTY WAIVER RESOLUTION</u> – Francis explained this is done annually and allows the Board to waive late penalties to a senior citizen, paraplegic, quadriplegic, eligible serviceman or servicewoman, eligible veteran, eligible widow, totally and permanently disabled person, or blind person. Motion was made by Francis, seconded by Tienvieri to approve this Resolution, as presented. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Francis, Tienvieri, Clements, Steiner, Montri, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none.

APPROVAL OF THE RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH THE 2020 SEWER USE CHARGES — Francis explained the 2020 rate changes for sewer usage. Motion was made by Francis, seconded by Steiner to approve the Resolution to establish sewer use charges for the year 2020 for the Bedford Township Sanitary Sewage Service Systems, as presented. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Francis, Steiner, Montri, Tienvieri, Clements, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none. APPROVAL FOR FUNDS TO REPLACE THE DAMAGED SHERIFF VEHICLE — The Board approved purchasing three 2020 Utility Police Interceptor vehicles at the November 5th meeting. Due to a recent accident, a fourth vehicle is now needed. The cost to outfit the vehicles with the Sheriff's equipment is still not known. Motion was made by Francis, seconded by Clements to approve the recommendation to purchase the fourth 2020 Police Interceptor. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Francis, Clements, Montri, Steiner, Tienvieri, Hershberger & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: none.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Logan Tisdale, 1308 Brandywine – spoke regarding traffic stops, wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year and asked people to remember those serving and not home for Christmas.

REPORT FROM TOWNSHIP BOARD MEMBERS

<u>Clements</u> – asked Francis to include self-financing in the analysis he is preparing regarding the Fire station renovation, thanked the Board and residents for a good year and wished them a Merry Christmas.

Montri - thanked the Save Our Senior volunteers and wished everyone a Merry Christmas.

<u>Tienvieri</u> – expressed her appreciation to the Save Our Senior volunteers and to the Ordinance Department.

<u>Steiner</u> – questioned a number on the budget amendment and wished everyone a safe, Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

<u>Francis</u> – mentioned the tax bills had been mailed out and payment can be mailed in, put in the drop box or paid online; anyone needing assistance should call his office; the space on the bills is limited so he explained the line that reads Bedford Debt on the tax bills is for the School Bond issue voted through last November 2018.

<u>Hershberger</u> – wished residents a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, and thanked the Bedford Fire Department paramedics and Sheriff's department for all they did for her family a couple weeks ago.

<u>Pirrone</u> – felt there was good conversation tonight regarding the budget issues and mentioned the demolition of the Michigan Tavern should be happening soon. He then informed the Board of a partnership he is working on with Bedford Schools regarding the purchase of salt for the roads. The School plans to build a salt mill at the school bus garage using some of the Township blocks. The Township will store two pieces of equipment at this garage. This will not cost the Township any additional money. Tienvieri asked for periodic updates on what the Township is paying for this salt. Steiner felt a basic agreement should be drawn up. Goldsmith agreed to draw up this Intergovernmental Agreement. Pirrone mentioned some Township sewer pipes are being repaired through the SAW grant and ITC is replacing many of the old wooden poles. He then wished everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and thanked all the volunteers.

<u>Francis</u> – expressed, on behalf of the Board, deep condolences to Trudy and her family in the passing of her father. He will be missed and her family needs to remember their pleasant memories of him.



The department requests approval for a Hazardous Materials First Responder Offensive Course (Hazmat IQ) for our membership. The Hazmat IQ course is a 4-hour nationally recognized course that builds upon the Hazmat Operations course to provide techniques for identifying and addressing Hazardous Materials incidents.

Hazardous Materials incidents are very challenging for first responders. These low-frequency events have the potential to seriously impact the community as well as our responders.
