APPOINTMENT OF DENNIS HARRIS AND BENJAMIN AMOS AS ALTERNATES TO THE BOARD OF REVIEW FOR 1ST TERMS ENDING 12/31/2021 – Motion was made by Tienvieri, seconded by Hershberger to appoint Dr. Dennis Harris and Benjamin Amos to the Board of Review for a two-year term as alternative members. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Tienvieri, Hershberger, Montri, Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: Francis, Clements & Steiner.

APPROVE THE MONROE COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION CONTRACT FOR STONEGATE SUBDIVISION SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT – Hershberger explained the Township's cost is \$251,500.00, the MCRC's portion is \$3,600.00 for a total cost of \$255,100.00. Motion was made by Hershberger, seconded by Tienvieri to approve the MCRC Stonegate Subdivision SAD contract, as presented. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Hershberger, Tienvieri, Montri & Pirrone. Nays: none. Absent: Francis, Clements & Steiner.

APPROVE A BID FOR THE HVAC PROJECT AT THE BEDFORD BRANCH LIBRARY – Much discussion occurred regarding the bids and the various systems and whether to include option one, which would provide a panel for lighting controls. Motion was made by Pirrone, seconded by Montri to approve the bid from CSO – Control Systems of Ohio, 4935 Harroun Road, Sylvania, OH for \$44,478.00, minus option one. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Pirrone, Montri, Tienvieri & Hershberger. Nays: none. Absent: Francis, Clements & Steiner. Pirrone agreed he would get quotes for option one.

REZONE PARCEL NUMBER 5802-034-020-00 AND A PORTION OF 5802-034-018-00 (TEMPERANCE ANIMAL HOSPITAL) FROM C-1, LOCAL BUSINESS TO C-3, GENERAL BUSINESS – The applicant confirmed she wanted to move forward with her request, despite having only four Board members present. Motion was made by Tienvieri, seconded by Pirrone to approve the request from CLR Holding, LLC to rezone from C-1, Local Business, to C-3, General Commercial, parcel number 5802-034-020-00 (location of Temperance Animal Hospital) and a portion of parcel number 5802-034-018-00, located on the south side of Sterns Road, on the west side of Lewis Avenue, Temperance Michigan with the following conditions: it is consistent with the Township Master plan goals and policies as well as the mixed-use future land use designation; the subject parcels are adjacent to an existing C-3 zoned parcel fronting Sterns Road; should the rezoning be approved, the applicant will be required to combine the C-3 portions and the C-1 portions; it is supported by adequate utility and road infrastructure; the stated use, a reconstructed Veterinary Hospital/Clinic clearly points to a plan for the property as opposed to a desire to increase the property's marketability; and re-development in the C-3 zoning district will need to comply with the site and development standards of the Township's Zoning Ordinance, which include adherence to the site and architecture design manual and protective screening from residential uses. Motion carried on a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Tienvieri, Pirrone, Montri & Hershberger. Nays: none. Absent: Francis, Clements & Steiner.

REPORT FROM TOWNSHIP BOARD MEMBERS

Tienvieri – expressed her concern with the amount of money in the Fund balance and feels there is sufficient funds to put aside money toward the Capital Improvement Plan.

Montri – appreciates the Library Advisory Board and hopes that the motion contrary to their recommendation will not be taken negatively by them.

Hershberger – informed residents that the absentee applications have been mailed out and since this is a closed primary, voters must choose which type of ballot they would like. If any voter would like an application, they should just contact the Clerk's office.

Pirrone – mentioned the Business Summit is being held Friday; there was an emergency road closure at Secor and Sterns and asked residents to be patient due to the construction in this area; expressed his excitement regarding the approval of the Stonegate SAD; and reported the recently snow plowing was a huge success.

Dear Chief Administrative Officer:

The Glenn Steil State Revenue Sharing Act of 1971, Public Act 140 of 1971, Section 21(2) states that units of local government (local units) that end their fiscal year in a deficit condition shall formulate a deficit elimination plan. Any assessment of a local unit's deficit condition should be made using the guidelines provided in Treasury Website (Numbered Letter 2016-1).

The Community Engagement and Finance Division received an audit report from your local unit for the fiscal year ending 2019. Your Certified Public Accountant has indicated a deficit in one or more funds as follows:


If a deficit exists in the General Fund, the General Fund plan should include a monthly breakdown of revenues and expenditures for the first two years of the projection and annual detail for the remaining years. For example, a five-year plan would show

monthly detail for 24 months, and annual detail for the remaining three years. When a revised plan is submitted in the subsequent year, it would include a monthly breakdown for two years and an annual breakdown for the remaining two years. The monthly breakdown shall be for actual revenue and expenditures expected that month. For example, property taxes should be included in the months the taxes are projected to be actually collected. It shall not be merely the annual revenue and expenditures divided by 12 months. This will allow for a more meaningful picture of how the municipality is progressing on a monthly basis.

Except where indicated "No Plan Necessary," within 30 days from the date of this letter please upload a deficit elimination plan for all funds listed above and a certified resolution online by visiting Michigan.gov/MunicipalFinance and select Deficit Elimination Plan Upload. Should a plan not be filed within 30 days, we may withhold 25% of the local unit's State Incentive Payments or payments issued under Public Act 140 of 1971, the Glenn Steil State Revenue Sharing Act of 1971. Once withheld, payments are not released when a plan has been *filed*, but when a plan has been *evaluated and certified* by Treasury.



**RESOLUTION TO DECLARE SUPPORT FOR THE SECOND AMENDMENT IN
BEDFORD TOWNSHIP**

I. Statements in Support of Resolution

THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BEDFORD, COUNTY OF MONROE, STATE OF MICHIGAN, STATES:

WHEREAS, the Township Board of the Township of Bedford, pursuant to Michigan statute, is vested with the authority of administering the affairs of the Township and is organized as a body corporate with powers and immunities provided by law, and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Bedford Township; and

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution, ratified in 1791 as part of the Bill of Rights, protects the right of the people to keep and bear arms; and

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in *District of Columbia v. Heller*, 554 U.S. 570 (2008), affirmed an individual's right to possess a firearm, unconnected with service in a militia, and to use that firearm for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the home; and

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in *McDonald v. Chicago*, 561 U.S. 742 (2010), affirmed that the right of an individual to "keep and bear arms," as protected under the Second Amendment, is incorporated to the States by the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment; and

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in *United States v. Miller*, 307 U.S. 174 (1939), opined that possession or use of a firearm that has some reasonable relationship to the preservation of a well-regulated militia is protected by the Second Amendment; and

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution (1963) provides that "Every person has a right to keep and bear arms for the defense of himself and the state"; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Board to declare its support of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and to the provisions of the Michigan Constitution which protect Bedford Township citizens' individual rights to keep and bear arms; and

WHEREAS, each Bedford Township official, as provided by Article XI, Section 1, of the Michigan Constitution (1963), took an oath to support the United States Constitution and the Michigan Constitution.

II. Resolution

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BEDFORD HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

RESOLVED, the Township Board declares its support for the Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution as well as Section 6 Article I of the Michigan Constitution, relating to the right of Bedford Township citizens to keep and bear arms.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Board affirms its support for Monroe County officials, in the exercise of their sound discretion, to support and enforce the constitutional right of Monroe County citizens to legally keep and bear arms, and to not support and enforce unconstitutional firearms laws.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Michigan State Legislature (House of Representatives and State Senators), the Governor of Michigan, and all of the Michigan U.S. Congressmen.
